

2026 International Conference for Healthy Ageing and Community Resilience

We welcome abstracts (in English, up to 300 words) for oral or poster presentations addressing “Healthy Ageing and Community Resilience”. Submissions should include the following sections: Background, Aims, Methods, Results, and Conclusion.

- Due to limited space and time, only limited abstracts may enter oral session. At submission, the author may choose if the abstract should be considered for poster presentation if not selected for oral presentation.
- As all oral and poster presentations are simultaneous, each delegate could submit ONLY ONE abstract as main presenter.
- For those who submit multiple abstracts as presenters, only the last abstract submission will be considered.

Abstract Submission Themes

The 2026 International Conference for Healthy Ageing and Community Resilience welcomes oral and poster abstract submissions related to the following themes:

- **Integrated Care and Ageing in Place for Community Resilience**
This theme focuses on innovative models and evidence-based practices that strengthen integrated care systems and support older adults to age in place. Submissions may address hospital-to-community transitions, long-term care integration, ICOPE implementation, intrinsic capacity, frailty prevention, fall prevention, medication safety, nutrition, rehabilitation, chronic disease management, and community-based interventions.
We particularly welcome studies that demonstrate how multidisciplinary care, proactive screening, and coordinated services can improve health outcomes, reduce preventable risks, and enhance resilience among older adults living in the community.
- **Social Innovation, Social Prescribing, and Supportive Communities**
This theme explores how social innovation and community-based strategies can promote healthy ageing, social connectedness, and resilience. Relevant topics include social prescribing, community participation, mutual-support networks, co-living communities, Blue Zone-inspired models, age-friendly environments, indigenous and rural community care, and cross-sector collaboration between health care, social care, and local communities.
Submissions may include research, policy analysis, implementation studies, or practical models that strengthen community capacity and create supportive environments for older adults and their families.
- **Person-Centered Well-being, Caregiver Support, and Meaningful Later Life**
This theme highlights person-centered approaches that promote well-being, dignity, meaning, and quality of life in later life. Submissions may focus on caregiver support, dementia care, behavioral and psychological symptoms of dementia, mental well-being, loneliness, micro-happiness, mindfulness, resilience, social relationships, life meaning, and supportive care for older adults and their families.
We welcome abstracts that examine how care systems and communities can move beyond disease-centered care toward holistic, compassionate, and meaningful support for ageing well.

ORAL PRESENTATION

- Oral sessions allow authors to present their research in 10 minutes in English or Mandarin.

 - First place: \$5,000 NTD
 - Second place: \$4,000 NTD
 - Third place: \$3,000 NTD
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POSTER PRESENTATION

- A poster presentation allows an author to provide a visual summary of their research. A poster should be prepared in English and should be self-contained and self-explanatory, allowing different viewers to proceed on their own while the author is free to supplement or discuss points raised in enquiry.
 - Poster size is 150cm(W)*90cm(H)
 - Awards:
 - First place: \$3,000 NTD
 - Second place: \$2,000 NTD
 - Third place: \$1,500 NTD
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SUBMISSION FORMAT AND SUBMISSION

- All abstracts should be written in English (300 words maximum) with the following sections: Background, Aims, Methods, Results, Conclusion.
 - Deadline: September 15th, 2026, by 12:00 Midnight (Taipei Standard Time Zone)
 - Submit the document in Word format.

- Clarity of abstract and alignment with abstract format for the conference
- Implications and significance of the study/project
- Relevance to the conference topics.
