- **Article 1** These regulations are designed to support YZU students in need of financial assistance, helping them complete their studies smoothly and fostering a positive mindset.
- Article 2 Applicants' average grade meets the passing standard, and the minima of moral conduct grade of 80 in the last semester (no such regulation for first-semester freshman, are eligible as following: (Yu-Ziang Scholarship winner not eligible)
 - I. Low-income households or straitened family circumstances.
 - II. Family meets emergent or unexpected situations.
 - III. Suffering natural disasters.
 - IV. Disability community: family income below NTD \$0.9 million in the last year and total value of real estate below NTD \$6.5 million.
 - V. Indigenous community: family income below NTD \$0.9 million in the last year. VI. Other special reasons.
- Article 3 The scholarship is scheduled once in every semester. The application deadline is determined based on the announcement made by the affiliated department/institute. Please submit your application to your department/institute. Overdue case will not be accepted.
- **Article 4** The amount and allocation of financial assistance are as follows:
 - I. Each department/institute/college/degree program can recommend several applicants. Recipients of financial assistance can receive a maximum of NT\$30,000 per semester.
 - II. According to budget for the academic year, the allocated amounts for each college are based on the proportion of student numbers in each college.

Article 5 Application requirement:

I. A completely filled application form.

- II. Supporting documents, for example: official lists of whole-family income and properties, as well as other relevant official documents.
- III. An official academic transcript up to the previous semester. (no such regulation for first-semester freshman)
- IV. Other relevant documents that proves the applicant in need of financial assistance (for example, recommendation letter from advisors or teachers).

After the first-step review by the affiliated department, the recommended document final review by the affiliated college, and then announce the list of recipients.

- Article 6 The funding of this financial aid comes from the tuition and miscellaneous fees budget for educational subsidies in each academic year. After confirming the list of recipients, each college should submit the list to the Office of Student Affairs which apply to General Accounting Office for payment.
- **Article 7** After approval from the Student Affair Committee Meeting, these regulations will become effective and any amendments will follow the same process.

In case of any discrepancy between the Chinese and English versions, the Chinese version shall prevail.
