Yuan Ze University Encouragement Policy for Faculty Participation in Far East Business Residency Program Grant

Apr 13, 2022: Adpoted at the 19th Administrative Council Meeting, Academic Year 2021

- Article 1 The policy has been specifically formulated to strengthen the exchange between our university and various affiliated enterprises of the Far East Group, establish collaborative understandings, and enhance the overall research and development capabilities of both parties
- Article 2 This policy applies to full-time faculty members of YZU, including full-time professional and technical instructors, as well as adjunct faculty members.
- Article 3 Faculty members undertaking in-depth research or service at Far East enterprises are prioritized to conduct these activities during the summer vacation or academic break periods each academic year. A minimum of 10 working days per month is allocated for on-site service, and the actual attendance schedule is subject to mutual agreement between the faculty member and the enterprise.
- Article 4 Faculty members are required to fill out an application form and the Far East Enterprise Residency Service Agreement prior to providing on-site services at Far East enterprise. The documents will undergo review by the Research and Development Office following the administrative process, be submitted for approval to the President of YZU. Upon approval, the Office of Personnel will process the official leave registration.
- Article 5 The annual subsidy budget is contingent on the Research and Development Office's allocation for transportation expenses in each academic year. The subsidy for each case ranges from 20,000 to 40,000 NT dollars.
 - 1. Applications will be processed based on the order in which they are received by the Research and Development Office, with priority given to non-duplicate applications. Subsidies will be provided until the funds are exhausted, following the principle of first-come, first-served. Any changes to the annual budget will be subject to announcements from the Research and Development Office.
 - 2. The principle for transportation expense subsidies from the Research and Development Office is set at 20,000 NT dollars per case. If the transportation expenses covered by the group company are less than 20,000 NT dollars, the Research and Development Office may, depending on the budget situation for that year, supplement the shortfall up to a maximum of 40,000 NT dollars.
 - 3. Applicants are required to submit receipts and an effectiveness report within one month after the completion of the residency service. They should also participate in related events as necessary.
- Article 6 To encourage faculty members to engage in residency service at Far East enterprises, the university will issue a certificate of enterprise professorship upon

the completion of the residency service. Additionally, the affiliated enterprise will be requested to provide a consultant certificate.

- Article 7 After the completion of the residency service, if the establishment of an intellectual project results in a total project amount reaching 1 million New Taiwan dollars, the following reward mechanisms can be chosen:
 - 1. Faculty members can apply to offset 2 hours of teaching hours in the current academic year or the following academic year, as stipulated.
 - 2. Additionally, the proportion of expenses borne by the inventors for patent application-related fees will be reduced.
- Article 8 These regulations, as well as all subsequent revisions therewith, shall be duly adopted by the Administrative Council prior to implementation.
